

# Communication Survey Response

Thank you to all of those who completed the communication survey we sent out last half term. I really appreciate your feedback and honesty. We are trying hard to get things right and know that we can always adapt how we work to make improvements. We are listening to you, and although I know we won't always be able to meet everyone's requirements, we will do our best to go with the majority and make any changes necessary.

One of the key messages we received from the feedback was that you receive a high number of emails from our system in a week, and not all these are useful or relevant to all, meaning the important things can get missed. We appreciate this and want to help with that. **In response to this, we are going to produce a weekly briefing and updates newsletter for you to pull all this information into one communication.** Thus, hoping that we can reduce the number of emails you receive from us in a week.

Another key point we took from the responses was that many of you are not wanting to be informed of changes to the dinner menu. However, we do know that for some of you this affects your child and you do want to know. To try to ensure the people who want to be informed can be, **we are setting up an email correspondence group for those of you who do want to be informed of any changes to menus each week.** Therefore, this will be an opt in service and you will need to inform the office that you wish to be part of this group. From now on, the parents in this group only will be informed of dinner changes. So those of you who no longer wish to receive this communication will not get those messages.

It was also reported that key information from teachers, specific to your individual child, can be lost in the number of messages you receive as it comes from the same St Michael's email system. To help with this, **teachers will communicate directly with you from their own email address on a one-to-one basis when contacting you about your child individually regarding any pastoral issues or in response to any concerns you may have.** First aid notifications will still come from the system, however.

Finally, it was noted that although some feel there are too many emails in a week, they wish to **receive reminders of key dates, events and equipment required on a weekly basis**, rather than having this information only sent at the beginning of term, or last minute. This information will be added into the weekly briefings and updates to help you to plan for the week ahead. Wherever possible, class teachers will inform you in their half termly phase newsletters of what children will need across the term and what days PE will be on etc.

Although we endeavour to make things more streamlined and update our procedures to make improvements, we are aware that there will be things we need to inform you of at times and will need to send some additional emails throughout the week. We do hope that we can help to some extent with these plans, and that you will feel communication is improved. Please do come and chat to me at any point if you have other suggestions or if you feel things are not working for the better. I will take things on board and do what we can to continue to improve.

## Key Points

- **Weekly briefing update newsletter to share majority of information in one email per week**
- **Dinner menu changes opt-in group – inform office to receive communication**
- **Individual emails to parents from class teachers to come direct from their emails to help differentiate**
- **Key dates, events and reminders to be shared weekly**

# Do I need to keep my child off school?



<b>Chicken Pox</b> At least 5 days from onset of rash and until all spots have crusted over	<b>Conjunctivitis</b> No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed	<b>Diarrhea &amp; /or Vomiting</b> 48 hours from last episode	<b>Respiratory Illness</b> (e.g colds & flu) Can return when no longer have a high temperature and well enough	<b>Glandular Fever</b> No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed	
<b>Hand, foot &amp; mouth</b> No need to stay off if well enough, but school or nursery should be informed	<b>Impetigo</b> Until lesions are crusted & healed or 48 hours after commencing antibiotics	<b>Head Lice</b> No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed	<b>Measles</b> 4 days from onset of rash	<b>Mumps</b> 5 days from onset of swelling	<b>German Measles (Rubella)</b> 5 days from onset of rash
<b>Scarlet Fever</b> 24 hours after commencing antibiotics	<b>Scabies</b> Until after first treatment	<b>Slapped Cheek</b> No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed	<b>Threadworms</b> No need to stay off but school or nursery should be informed	<b>Tonsillitis</b> Can return when no longer have a temperature and well enough, school or nursery should be informed	<b>Whooping Cough</b> 48 hours after commencing antibiotics

Use this guide to find out when they should stay off, and when they can go back if they are well enough to do so.
