

Staffing Updates

We welcome Mrs Foxall, who has joined us in Buttercups class in Foundation, this academic year. The children are already settling in well and I think Mrs Foxall will be a huge asset to our school.

Emily has children in the school and is supporting with supervision of lunchtimes and developing play between children during this time. This is another great addition to our team here at St Michael's. We are always looking



for additional support at lunch and I will have another vacancy advert going out for a part time team member to join us at lunches. Please, if you are interested or know anyone who might be able to help us out, do come and chat with me about the role.

It is with great excitement that I announce to you that Miss Beaumont is expecting a baby. She is due at the start of next year and will commence her maternity leave from the Christmas break. We are looking to ensure we appoint someone for Peony class and will update you once we have a staff member in place.



Other exciting updates are that Mr Marshall has been appointed as Assistant Head Teacher. Mr Marshall will support the school leadership alongside Mrs Taylor, who remains as the Deputy Head, as I have decreased my working days at St Michael's.
